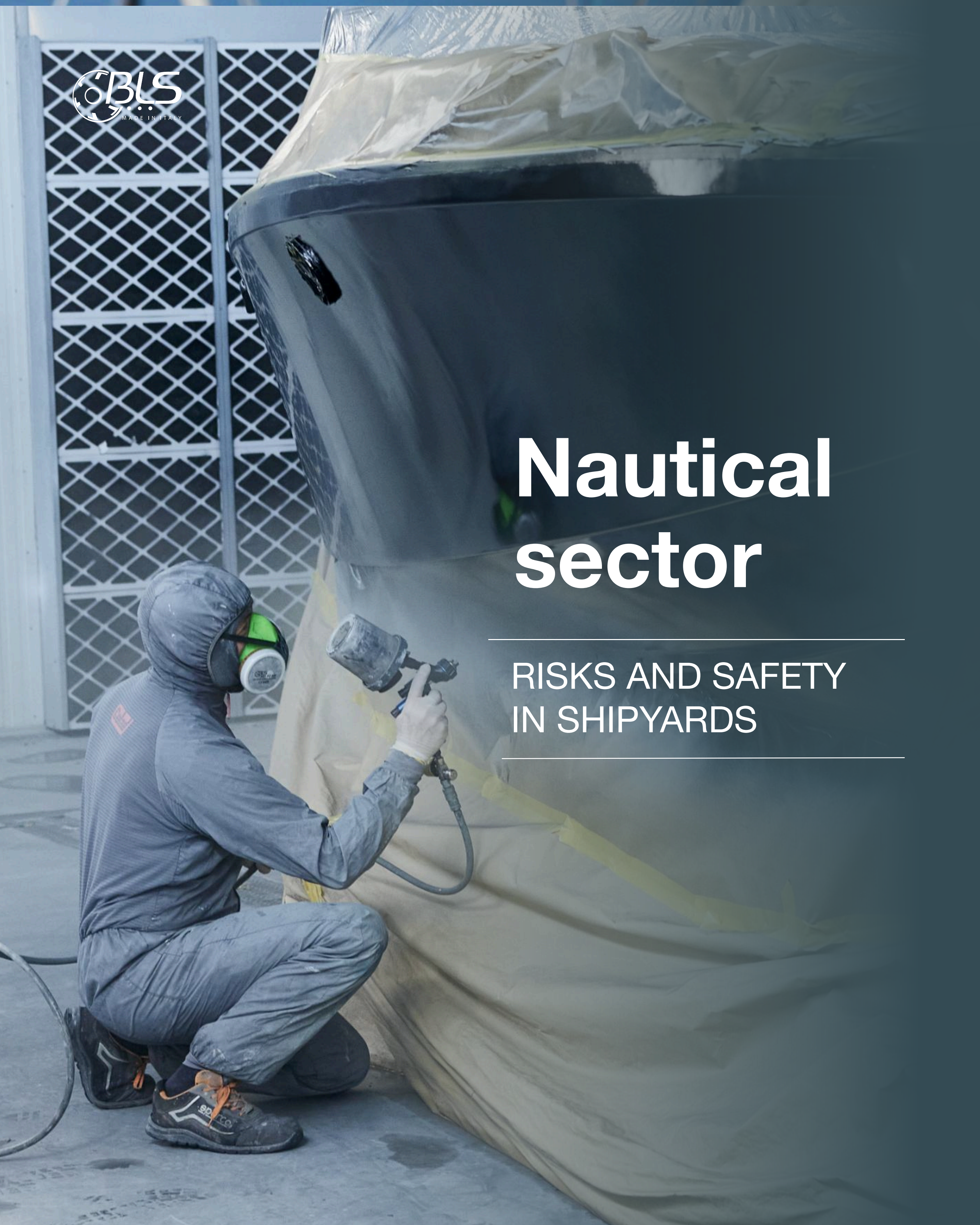


Nautical sector

RISKS AND SAFETY
IN SHIPYARDS





Working in a *shipyard* exposes to various *respiratory health risks*. To prevent and reduce risks, it is necessary to adopt a series of *safety measures* concerning both the organisation of work and the personal protection of workers. Among these measures, the first is to always *wear a protective mask*.





There are several hazardous situations on construction sites that could cause (or contribute to) respiratory diseases. The main ones are:

- **Handling of chemical agents**
- **Exposure to dust/fibres/fumes**
- **Poor ventilation, high temperatures, humidity and low oxygen**

PRODUCTION

During the construction it is necessary to use protection suitable for resin.

We recommend the use of half-masks with A2P3 filters. For prolonged exposure or eye protection, a full-face mask with the same filters is preferable.

For operations such as carpentry, where particles are generated, an FFP3 filtering face piece is a practical and effective solution.

MAINTENANCE

During maintenance operations such as sanding or welding, the use of FFP3 filtering pieces or half-masks with P3 filters is required.

For painting, a half mask with A2P2 protection can be used. If protection is also required for the eyes, a full face mask with glass visor and A2P3 filters, resistant to solvents and chemicals, is preferable.
